Create a birds nest

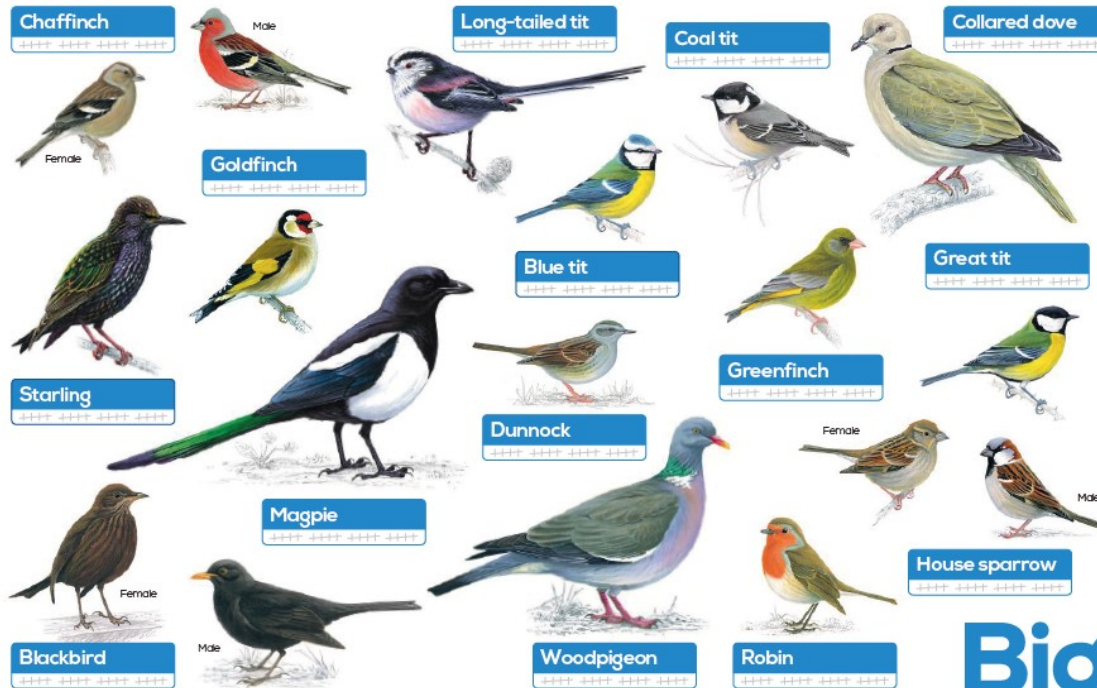
Sing a bird song e.g. 2 Little Dickie Birds or 5 Little Ducks

### Activity

Create your own bird feeder and attract the birds to your home!

### You will need

- Toilet roll
- Peanut butter
- Bird seed
- String



Gather cardboard boxes, loo rolls, recycled paper and newspaper.



Cover the cardboard boxes with recycled paper or newspaper.



Use peanut butter, marmalade or jam. To stick the bird seed/cereals, onto your feeder.



Add string and hang up for the birds.
