
We break up for Easter on Thursday, 1st April and return on Monday, 19th April.

Teaching and Learning

It is great to welcome all children back to nursery and the children have particularly explored outdoor learning in the garden. They are enjoying moving freely with friends and developing their gross motor skills as they climb, push wheeled toys, build dens, play games of hide and seek and develop imaginary play experiences with their friends. Children have embraced changes in the weather, as they have splashed in puddles and created mud-pies and then sat on deckchairs and read books in the sunshine.





For World Book Day at nursery we provided lots of book sharing, story activities & imaginary play experiences. We hope you enjoyed the new booklet that we produced called 'Information for Parents on Literacy in the Early Years Foundation Stage' and had the opportunity to try out some of the fun learning activities together with your child at home.

For Chatter Matters week the theme is 'Build it up together'. We will be supporting communication and sharing our strategies through constructive play. The children will get the opportunity to engage in using blocks, recyclable resources and natural lose parts to create. Teaching staff will support children to develop their communication and language skills through using the following time to talk strategies:

- Be face to face
- Follow the child's lead
- Wait for eye contact
- Reduce closed questions
- Give praise
- Match and add
- Repeat, repeat, repeat
- Use gestures, signs, pointing and facial expression
- Slow down and simplify.
